#### What is the "right to a bank account"?

Everyone needs a bank account, to pay bills and receive income.

If you have already tried several banks and are unable to open an account, you can exercise your legal right to a deposit account by contacting the Banque de France.

Once you've submitted your application, the Banque de France will appoint a high street bank to open an account for you. You will also be provided with a number of basic banking services, free of charge, including: issuance and receipt of bank transfers, direct debits and a debit card with systematic authorisation. You will not be entitled to a chequebook or overdraft.

#### Who can exercise their right to an account?

The procedure is open to individuals resident in France who do not already own a bank account.

It is also available to French nationals resident abroad, and to foreign nationals legally resident in a European Union country other than France. The service can also be used by sole traders and legal entities resident in France.

#### How do you go about exercising your right?

The procedure is straightforward. You will need to provide the Banque de France with the following documents:

- a certificate from a bank or equivalent stating that you have been denied an account
- a completed application form
- official and valid proof of identity
- proof of address (issued within the last three months)
   (You may be asked to provide additional documents, notably if you

are a sole trader or representative of a legal entity.)

Exercising your right to an account is free of charge. It is a public service.
